### **Psalm 96**

- 1 Sing to the LORD, sing praise in a new song;  
Sing to him all who to the earth belong!
- 2 Sing to the LORD and praise his holy name;  
From day to day his saving work proclaim.
- 3 His glory to the nations now declare;  
His mighty deeds to people everywhere.
  
- 7 O praise the LORD, you nations, every tribe,  
Both strength and glory to the LORD ascribe.
- 8 Give to the LORD the glory that is due;  
Come to his courts and bring a gift with you.
- 9 Worship the LORD in his great holiness;  
Tremble with fear, all earth, before his face.

Christ is mine forevermore!
- Come rejoice now, O my soul  
For His love is my reward  
Fear is gone and hope is sure

## 1) The Future City the LORD Will Establish

*Walk in the light of the LORD (2:1–5)*

## 2) The Present City the LORD Will Humble

*Stop trusting human pride and false gods (2:6–4:1)*

## 3) The Purified City the LORD Will Restore

*Hope in the LORD's just salvation (4:2–6)*
